

#### Freedom Boat Club – What is It?

- World's oldest and largest membership boat club with over 30 years of experience

- The initiation fee is \$5500
- There are three plans:
  - There is a 3 month plan which costs \$213 per month. This is billed monthly over a twelve month period. You can choose which months you want and the months can be changed. So you are not locked into the same months every year.
  - The 6 month plan is \$299 per month and the monthly fee is paid all year at \$299 a month.
  - The 12 month membership is our best value and you have reciprocity at over 300 clubs. This plan is \$399 a month.
- The three most common boats are:
  - Deck Boat, Pontoon Boat and Fishing Boats
  - Some Marinas have Sailboats

Lessons Learned Discussion <u>Dave Rogers</u>

#### **Required Safety Items for your Vessel**

- Navigation Lights Corrode and can become Inoperable
  - Clean the bulb ends and Housing contact points
  - Spray on electrical conductor / corrosion inhibitor







Lessons Learned Discussion <u>Dave Rogers</u>

#### **Required Safety Items for your Vessel**

- Life Jacket Storage Zipper cases corrode and "freeze"
  - Lubricate with Zipper Grease

Lessons Learned Discussion <u>Dave Rogers</u>

#### **Required Safety Items for your Vessel**

- Throwable Flotation
  - Cushion is minimum but not retrievable
  - Purchase a Retrievable Flotation Device for \$29









Lessons Learned Discussion <u>Dave Rogers</u>

- Exceed the Minimum Requirements
  - VHF Radio Register it
  - First Aid Kit Why wouldn't you have one?
  - Spot Light or Flash Light w/ Fresh batteries
  - Anchor and Line
  - Navigational Charts
- What If's?
  - Engine Won't start Who Ya Gonna Call?, Sea Tow, Boat U.S.
  - No Cell Phone Service How to Signal
  - Medical Emergency Passenger, Vessel Captain
  - Vessel / People Rescue
  - If Captain becomes unable to pilot the vessel or needs to be rescued. Does a crew member know what to do?
  - You run aground



Lessons Learned Discussion <u>Dave Rogers</u>

- Kayak Specific
  - Paddle Leash
  - Water
  - Plastic Bag for Trash
  - Waterproof Cell Phone Case
  - VHF Radio
  - First Aid Kit Clean a wound/cut, Anti Bacterial Ointment, Bandage
  - Knife
  - Other Lessons Learned?



#### Dave Rogers

- Considerations
  - Wind Look for flags or trees
  - Current Coast your boat, look for anything moving on the water, wake around a piling
  - Vessel Speed slower the better
  - Surroundings
    - Traffic
    - Immovable Objects
    - Audience Both Onboard and On Land
  - Use bumpers on the side of your boat
  - Have your dock lines ready



#### Dave Rogers

#### 4 Steps to Docking

- 1. Approach Line it up
  - Wind and Current will determine your approach

• Use a shallow approach, 10-15 degrees, if the wind and or current is pushing you into the dock


• Use a steeper approach, 30 degrees, if the wind and or current is pushing away from the dock

- 2. Come in Slow
  - Bump the engine In and Out of Gear
  - Neutral is your friend
  - Never approach a dock any faster than you are willing to HIT it.
- 3. Time your swing
- 4. Finish
  - Get a line on a cleat



#### Dave Rogers

No Wind or Wind Into the Dock Toss the Bow Line over a Dock Cleat




Docking with no wind. Approach the dock at 15°. Next, turn slightly to starboard—your momentum will continue to take you toward the dock. Apply light power in reverse when you come in contact with the dock to slow your progress and to walk the stern to port. Tie the bow line first, then tie the remaining docklines.



#### Dave Rogers

Wind Away from the Dock Toss the Bow Line over a Dock Cleat




me almost parallel with the dock. Approach at a steep angle to cut through the wind. Flare the boat such that you me almost parallel with the dock. Toss an after bow spring line to a dockhand or put a crew member ashore in hand. Once secured, power forward with starboard helm to pull the boat to the dock.

Wind Away from the Dock Toss the Bow Line over a Dock Cleat



Docking between boats. Now that you have mastered the technique of docking with wind off the dock, docking between boats will be a snap. It is basically the same maneuver. Arrive at a steep angle to clear the boat behind. Toss an after bow spring line or flare nearly parallel with the dock and put a crew member ashore with the line. Powering forward against the spring line keeps the boat against the dock.
