

Replacement Tree List for The Shores

Name	Typical Mature Size	Tree Type	Comment
Dwarf Black Olive 'Shady Lady' (<i>Bucida buccera</i> 'Shady Lady')	25-30 ft tall 20 ft wide	Evergreen	Shade Tree. Shady lady is smaller version of black olive. Produces small insignificant yellow flowers in spring/summer which turns into a small black fruit.
Drake Chinese Elm (<i>Ulmus parvifolia</i> 'Drake')	35 ft tall 30-35 ft wide	Deciduous/ nearly evergreen	Shade Tree. Larger elm that stays green most of the year. Leaves are small and not messy- doesn't require raking.
Winged Elm (<i>Ulmus alata</i>)	25 ft tall 25 ft wide	Deciduous	Shade Tree. While it is a deciduous tree it remains green most of the year. Leaves are small and not messy- doesn't require raking.
Japanese Blueberry (<i>Elaeocarpus decifens</i>)	20-25 ft tall 15-20 ft wide	Evergreen	Accent or Shade Tree. Slow growing tree that can be maintained in a conical or topiary form or grown as a single trunk shade tree. Good choice for alkaline soils. Has small black fruit.
Magnolia 'Little Gem' (<i>Magnolia grandiflora</i> 'Little Gem')	15-20 ft tall 15 ft wide	Evergreen	Used as an accent tree.
Crape Myrtle (<i>Lagerstroemia indica</i>)	Size varies based on variety	Deciduous	Flowering tree that blooms in the summer-fall. Plant 8-10 feet away from pavement as blooms will drop. Other varieties: 20-30 ft: Natchez (White) & Tuscarora (Dark Coral Pink) 12-20 ft: Sioux (Dark pink); Catawba (Purple); Dynamite (Red) 15 ft: Acoma (White); Tonto (Fuschia)
Ligustrum Tree (<i>Ligustrum japonicum</i>)	15 ft tall 10 ft wide	Evergreen	Multi-trunk Accent tree. Good from screening. Primary problem is Cercospora leafspot—but it does not have to be controlled.
Trees listed below are beautiful, but not as cold tolerant as those listed above. They are generally fine in our area (Hardiness Zone 9b-10a).			
Pink Trumpet Tree (<i>Tabebuia heterophylla</i>)	20-25 ft tall	Evergreen	Accent Tree. Grows at a moderate rate. Leaves are palmately compound but briefly deciduous as the new leaves emerge. The showy display of pink or white, bell-shaped blooms appears throughout the spring and summer and is followed by the production of long, slender seedpods.
Geiger Tree (<i>Cordia sebestena</i>)	20 ft tall 10 ft wide	Evergreen	Accent Tree. Beautiful slow growing tree that blooms most of year with orange flowers. Does produce fruit (drupes) that does not attract wild life. Other varieties not as vigorous or hardy.
Geiger Tree (<i>Cordia boissieri</i>)	10-15 ft tall 10 ft wide	Evergreen	Accent Tree. White blooms – best planted in frost free protected areas.
Geiger Tree (<i>Cordia lutea</i>)	20-25 ft tall 10 ft wide	Evergreen	Accent Tree. Yellow blooms – best planted in frost free protected areas.
Cattley Guava or Strawberry Guava (<i>Psidium littorale</i>)	20 ft tall 10 ft wide	Evergreen	Accent tree with dark green glossy leaves and smooth, bark. Bores small edible fruit.
Note: Trees that bloom or produce small fruit should not be planted near pavement. Check maturity size for appropriate plant spacing and planting.
